


ALICE is an acronym for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed.

ALICE is our friend, family member or neighbor who works hard, yet struggles to afford the basic costs of living in Louisiana.

ALICE earns more than the Federal Poverty Level, but is unable to earn enough to meet the Louisiana average ALICE Household Survival Budget. (see **Figure 1**)



In 2021:

- Our state had the second-highest rate of families living at or below the ALICE threshold in the U.S., with 51% of Louisiana households struggling.
- Of Louisiana's 1,776,260 households, 339,916 earned below the Federal Poverty Level (19%) and another 562,552 (32%) were ALICE. (see Figure 2)
- Louisiana saw an increase of **22,980 more financially struggling households** compared to 2019, from 879,488 to 902,468, despite tax credits and other pandemic and Federal Emergency Management benefits.
- Between 2019 and 2021, the average **annual cost of basic expenses** for ALICE families **increased by 11%** for both single adults and families of four, with childcare, food and housing representing the largest expenses in a typical ALICE family's survival budget.
- Only **29**% of Louisiana households below the ALICE threshold had **emergency savings** equal to three months of expenses, which is a reduction from pre-pandemic levels of 37%.

Household Survival Budget

The bare-minimum costs of basic necessities (see Figure 1).

ALICE Threshold

The average income needed to afford the Household Suvival Budget. Households below the ALICE Threshold include both ALICE and poverty-level households.

ALICE

Households with income above the Federal Poverty Level but below the basic cost of living.


Poverty

Households earning below the Federal Poverty Level.

Note: Percent change is pre-tax. Full time hourly wage represents the wage needed at 40 hours per week to support the annual total, with credits. For the family of four, this represents the combined wage needed for two workers. For child care, the preschool cost is used for both children in child care. Many households incur higher costs, especially for housing, as units may not be available at Fair Market Rent.
