211 is a free, confidential service that helps people find the local resources they need; available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.








STATISTICS



CALLS BY CATEGORY

2,693 Total crisis calls handled

When people in crisis contact 211, callers are directly connected with an expert at the appropriate crisis line.

Call center staff are trained mental health professionals and nationally certified by the Alliance of Information and Referral Systems (AIRS).
